

Hairsprays




Spray cans easily spray into face and eyes if cap is pressed while facing the wrong way

Liniments

Liniment can easily be mistaken for other tubes like toothpaste




Children are at greater risk of poisoning during disruptions to routine such as when visitors are staying

Perfume




Adults' cosmetics and perfumes can be very appealing to children playing dress-up

Mothballs


Mothballs can be found in stored clothing.

Pill Boxes

Make a list of all pill names and keep it with the pillbox.
Also include colour, strength and number of each pill
